The principles outline a connected policy approach to supporting the growth of high-potential health innovation companies, to facilitate collaboration, foster future skills and talent development, strengthen clinical trials, boost medical manufacturing and accelerate the adoption of innovation for patient benefit in Victoria.

"It's good news that the payroll tax-free threshold for Victoria will rise to \$650 000 – which is still behind New South Wales at \$750,000 and Queensland at \$1.1Million - but is heading in right direction to support young, growing companies."

"Now all policy makers need to deliver investments based on our policy principles to grow investment and create jobs in the health innovation industry." Dr Evans said
