# MAKING IT HAPPEN

### Our 2025 recipient is Sally Kinrade



Sally Kinrade is Vice President at Medicines Development for Global Health (MDGH). With over 30 years of experience in the pharmaceutical industry and a foundation in clinical pharmacy practice, Sally has made a profound impact on medicines development, business operations, leadership and patients' lives.

Her career spans a broad range of operational and management roles,

including clinical R&D, pre-launch brand planning, and medical affairs. Sally has collaborated with local and international teams, including governments, advisors and philanthropists to drive the success of new medicines from early clinical development through market launch and growth phases.

More recently, Sally has been the moxidectin program leader. She has been responsible for leading her team to progress moxidectin, a medicine to treat onchocerciasis (river blindness), affecting more than 200 million people globally, from US FDA approval through all the processes necessary to bring it to patients to change their lives. Moxidectin is the first new drug for onchocerciasis in 30 years.

In addition to her operational expertise, Sally has led key business process improvement initiatives, optimising operations and ensuring the delivery of high-quality outcomes across organisations.

Her leadership philosophy is rooted in uniting teams under a common goal, developing clear strategies, fostering collaboration, and maintaining effective stakeholder engagement.

She is highly respected for her drive, determination, commitment and tenaciously pursuing goals such as achieving health equity by ensuring new and improved medicines are developed and reach patients in communities that are still underprivileged and sometimes war-torn. These included endemic communities in the Democratic Republic of Congo and Côte D'Ivoire, and Ghana where she set up a pilot implementation project.

Her enthusiasm for finding practical solutions to complex problems, her hands-on approach, business acumen, outstanding communication and negotiation skills are highly valued as are Sally's integrity, energy, ethics and warmth, empathy and support.

# MOVER AND SHAKER

### **Our 2025 recipient is Dr Anne-Laure Puaux**



Dr Anne-Laure Puaux is the Head of Business Development at the Walter and Eliza Hall Institute of Medical Research (WEHI) and the CEO of WEHI Ventures, the investment company established by WEHI to manage its new strategic investment fund "66ten". This fund is investing \$66 million over ten years to translate and commercialise WEHI scientific

discoveries into healthcare products and services.

Anne-Laure played a key role in conceptualising the fund's governance and operational framework, getting Board approval and initiating its activities. She led the recruitment of an industry-experienced management team as well as the assembly of an extraordinary group of globally experienced biotech entrepreneurs, investment managers and industry R&D leaders to serve as members of 66ten's Investment Review Committee.

Being a globally experienced leader in the life sciences sector, Anne-Laure started her career as an immunologist, and has held postdoctoral roles in academic institutions, and staff scientist positions within research and development departments of biopharma companies. She also has hands-on experience in the evaluation of new investment opportunities and in designing, negotiating and closing partnerships between global pharmaceutical companies, biotechnology companies and academic research institutions.

Anne-Laure holds a PhD from AgroParisTech based on her research work at Institute Pasteur in Paris, France and a Global Executive MBA from IE Business School in Madrid, Spain.

She is praised for her courage, resilience, clear vision, business acumen and strategic, big picture thinking and valued as a compassionate, inclusive leader, inspiring and instilling confidence in those around her. Anne-Laure is well-known for her thirst for continuous improvement, listening to others and driving progress for the ultimate benefit of patients in Australia and worldwide.
